## RESOURCES / NEW PSYCHOACTIVE SUBSTANCES INFORMATION BOOKLET



New Psychoactive Substances (NPS) refer to substances that mimic the effects of controlled drugs such as cannabis, cocaine, "Ecstasy", methamphetamine or heroin. They are produced by introducing slight modifications to the chemical structures of existing NPS and controlled drugs to create new variations that are not yet controlled.

In Singapore, NPS abuse remains a concern. It is one of the three most commonly abused types of drugs since 2018. In 2019, it was the second most commonly abused type of drugs amongst new abusers arrested.


Download CNB's NPS information booklet to equip yourself with factual information about the drug. You will also find plenty of free resources and activities to engage students and youths on the topic


## **HELP US SPREAD THE ANTI-DRUG MESSAGE**
